

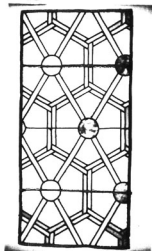

**Sullivan's Designs Highlighted
in Chicago**

Architectural Artifacts, Inc., a Chicago-based source for 19th and 20th century American architectural elements, will host an exhibit of Louis H. Sullivan-designed artifacts from some of the country's largest private Sullivan collections from July 22nd through August 31st. Architectural Artifacts is located in a 3000 square foot, 2 story showroom at 4325 North Ravenswood.

The exhibit is timed to coincide with Chicago '93, the city's centennial celebration of the World's Columbian Exhibition for which Sullivan designed the Transportation Building, one of the famous White City facades.

The exhibit is composed mostly of Sullivan's works from private collections, including items from real estate czar Seymour Persky and art dealer Scott Elliott.

In conjunction with the Sullivan exhibit opening, the Junior Board of the Art Institute of Chicago will host a benefit from 8 PM to 10:30 PM on July 22nd at Architectural Artifacts. For reservations for the benefit, call (312) 853-5941. □
